

Beginning 汉语 Chinese

The Confucius Institute at Arizona State University offers Beginning Chinese and Individual Tutoring in Chinese.

These courses are designed for individuals to gain a basic knowledge of Mandarin.

Chinese 1 is a comprehensive language course designed for people with no background in Chinese. Students will learn pronunciation, tones and basic grammar structures to create a solid foundation to build upon. This class will cover daily conversation topics such as how to greet people, introducing yourself, family and friends, how to talk about your plans, and how to buy things and eat in Chinese restaurants. While writing and reading skills are covered, speaking and listening skills are emphasized in the class. In addition, Chinese cultural elements are taught to supplement the course and impart the knowledge necessary to navigate within the Chinese culture.

Chinese 1A is designed for people who have successfully completed the Beginning Chinese I course. This course lays emphasis on improving the ability of the student to use Chinese for communication. By the end of this second course, students will be able to successfully engage in simple daily conversations such as how to check in at a hotel, how to pick up friends at the airport, and have a conversation at dinner or on a business trip. In addition, Chinese cultural elements are taught to supplement the course and impart the knowledge necessary to navigate within the Chinese culture.

Chinese 2 is intended to be a comprehensive language course for people who have successfully completed the Beginning Chinese 1 and 1a. It integrates functional communication with grammatical structures and presents the most essential and useful part of the language in daily life. This is done in order to enable the mastery of conversational sentences. This class consists of daily conversation topics, such as how to give directions, how to pay the bill, how to buy clothes and bargain, and how to send invitations in Chinese. In addition, Chinese cultural elements are taught to supplement the course and impart the knowledge necessary to navigate within the Chinese culture.
